Gun Deer

PROFESSIONAL wildlife management practices prescribed and implemented by a team of wildlife biologists maximize the inherently abundant 10,000 acres of mixed pine hardwood that comprises Westervelt Lodge in Pickens County, Alabama. Located along the Tombigbee River, these practices have been in place since “the Lodge” was established in 1951, securing it as a leader in quality white-tailed deer hunting in Alabama.

Our landscapes are developed to get wildlife in front of our guests. Depending on observed deer activity, acorn abundance, or stage of the rut, our guests hunt from either sturdy metal ladder stands positioned in hardwood bottoms, tripods and elevated blinds overlooking hub and spokes, wildlife clearcuts, or shooting houses on one of our many game foodplots. Guests may bring their own climbing stands if they wish.

Guests are asked to harvest only a mature buck, which means a 3½+ year-old buck with 8 or more points, and an inside spread of 16 or more inches. Our guests are welcome and encouraged to help manage our antlerless deer and are permitted to harvest one doe per day if they wish.

\$1,550 per person for two-day stay
Price includes all meals, lodging, transportation and cleaning and quartering of game.

Bag limit is one buck per day, 8 or more points and spread equal to or outside the ears, and one doe per day. Any additional buck harvested must be larger than first.
